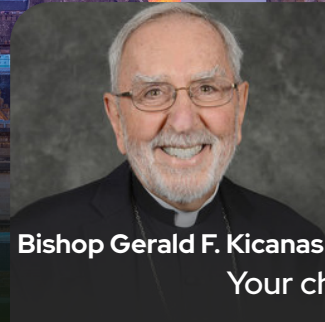

Saturday, March 18: Our pilgrimage begins as we depart our local airport for our overnight flight to Dublin, Ireland. Meals served on flight.

Sunday, March 19: Upon arrival in Dublin, one of the liveliest capitals in Europe, we'll have a quick tour of the city before hotel check-in. Before we gather for dinner, we'll celebrate Mass at St. Mary's Pro-Cathedral in honor of this Year of Mercy pilgrimage. Dinner. Evening at leisure. *Overnight Dublin, Ireland*

Monday, March 20: This morning, after breakfast, we'll travel through the beautiful mountains of Wicklow to reach Kilkenny. Visit Glendalough, an ancient monastic city, established in the sixth century by St. Kevin, in the heart of the valley of the two lakes (Gleann da Loch). There, we'll celebrate Mass at St. Kevin's, and then visit the Round Tower, the ruins of the cathedral, and St. Kevin's Kitchen. This afternoon we're off to Baltinglass to see the ruins of a Cistercian Abbey and Castledermot to visit the Franciscan Abbey. Dinner. Evening at leisure. *Overnight Limerick, Ireland*

Tuesday, March 21: Following breakfast, we start our day at Glenstal Abbey, a Benedictine monastery dedicated to Sts. Joseph and Columbia. Next visit is the Rock of Cashel, which stands high in the middle of the Golden Vale. We'll visit the Cormac Chapel and St. Mary's Cathedral. Back to the charming city of Limerick to explore King John's Castle in the heart of the medieval district and visit St. Mary's Cathedral, founded in 1168 and one of the oldest buildings in Limerick. Dinner. Evening at leisure. *Overnight Limerick, Ireland*

Wednesday, March 22: After breakfast, we're off to Blarney Castle, located in "the biggest little village in Ireland." Step back in time and climb the 110 steep steps to view the Blarney Stone and learn about Ireland's medieval past along the way. We'll also explore the grounds and have an opportunity to lunch and shop at the nearby Blarney Woolen Mills before proceeding on to Cork City. We proceed to Cork City, starting with a visit to St. Peter and Paul's Church, then we'll tour Cork City, visiting the historic Cork City Gaol, the picturesque harbor, and downtown. We finish the day at St. Fin Barre's Cathedral. Dinner. Evening at leisure. *Overnight Cork, Ireland*

Thursday, March 23: We set off today to visit Dingle Peninsula by way of the Eagle Mount and the cliffs of Sleah Head. We'll see the Gallarus Oratory built by the early monks dating back to the ninth century. We'll finish with Kilmalkedar Church, built in the twelfth century, once part of a complex of religious buildings. Dinner. Evening at

leisure. *Overnight Killarney, Ireland*

Friday, March 24: After breakfast, we depart Killarney for Killimer where we will cross the Shannon Estuary by Ferry. Once across we follow the coastline to visit the Cliffs of Moher in County Clare, a Victorian seaside resort. We'll then visit Corcomroe Abbey as well as the Cathedral of Galway. Dinner. Evening at leisure. *Overnight Galway, Ireland*

Saturday, March 25: This morning following breakfast, we set off for Knock, visiting Croagh Patrick, where St. Patrick fasted for forty days in 441. While there, we'll have the opportunity to climb the mountain or spend time at the visitor center enjoying the beautiful area surrounding Croagh Patrick. Upon arriving in Knock, we'll proceed to the Knock Shrine, considered one of the world's leading Marian shrines. We'll then proceed to the basilica, the largest church in Ireland. We enjoy our farewell dinner and evening at leisure. *Overnight Knock, Ireland*

Sunday, March 26: Today, we visit the town of Kildare and St. Brigid's Cathedral before departing for Glasgow, Scotland. Our tour of Glasgow includes George Square and nearby Glasgow Cathedral and St. Simon's Parish. Dinner. *Overnight Glasgow, Scotland*

Monday, March 27: This morning we follow the Loch Lomond through Fort William and stop at the Spean Bridge Woollen Mill. At Fort Augustus, we cruise on Loch Ness, home of the mystical beast "Nessie," before heading to our hotel in Strathpeffer and St. Mary's Church in Inverness. Dinner. *Overnight Strathpeffer, Scotland*

Tuesday, March 28: Today, we visit Culloden Visitor Centre to learn about the Battle of Culloden, where Bonnie Prince Charlie was defeated by the British army in 1746. We stop briefly at the Blair Athol Distillery in Pitlochry to sample their wares. We'll continue south to Fife to visit the shrine of St. Margaret at Dunfermline Abbey. Dinner. *Overnight Edinburgh, Scotland*

Wednesday, March 29: This morning, we visit Edinburgh Castle, which dominates the city and contains the Scottish Crown Jewels and the Stone of Scone. Following, we will visit the National Shrine of Saint Andrew, part of St. Mary's Cathedral, to venerate the relics of St. Andrew and participate in Mass. We'll then proceed to Melrose Abbey, which was founded in 1136 by Cistercian monks. Dinner. *Overnight Edinburgh, Scotland*

Thursday, March 30: We depart with a renewed sense of faith with fond memories and jubilant spirits.

Terms of Service

Itineraries: Itineraries are prepared and scheduled in advance according to the best information available at the time and are subject to change by the date of the pilgrimage.
Pricing: Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. reserves the right to adjust pricing should the following occur; (1) Rise in Airfare due to higher fuel costs, etc. (2) Rise in ground costs due to increases in hotel charges, bus fares, fees, taxes and other costs due to the fluctuating value of the U.S. dollar against foreign currency.
Deposits and Payments: A deposit of \$450 per person is required to hold your reservation of which \$200 is non-refundable (may be refundable under travel insurance conditions). Payment can be made by credit card or check. Call (800) 653-0017 to make a credit card payment.
Final payments: Final payment is due 75 days prior to the original departure date except in the case of postponement. The original departure date is a date of departure for which a new reservation is intended. In the event of postponement, if the decision of postponement is made sooner than 75 days prior to the original departure date, final payment will be due 75 days prior to the new departure date. If the decision of postponement is made 75 days prior to the original departure date or later then the payment remains due 75 days prior to the original departure date.
Cancellation fees: If the traveler's written notice of cancellation is received by Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. more than 75 days prior to the original departure date all payments made toward the price of the tour will be refunded, less a \$200 processing fee. For cancellations received 75 days or less prior to the trip; departure, the initial deposit of \$450 plus any applicable charges imposed by the airlines, hotels, and bus companies on Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours will be non-refundable. Please note that the amount may vary with each pilgrimage and the vendors we work with. In the event of postponement, the above still applies. Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. retains the right to cancel any pilgrimage up to the departure date in which case all funds received will be returned within 10 business days.
Baggage: Please follow the general rule of traveling light - If you cannot carry it do not bring it. Passengers are permitted one piece of luggage per person. Baggage handling is included for one suitcase per person only, whenever possible, in the cost of the pilgrimage. The airlines for international flights will not allow a suitcase exceeding 50 pounds (subject to change), if over 50lbs., the fees can be costly. On inter-European flights, which are not directly connected to a transatlantic flight the baggage weight limit is lower. We will provide you with this information in the final travel documents. Baggage handling is not available on any of the trains. Every effort will be made to handle luggage carefully, however Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. will not assume any liability for lost or damaged luggage or items inside luggage carrier. (Travel insurance may apply)
Travel insurance: We strongly recommend the purchase of travel insurance (personal accident/illness/injury/trip cancellation/baggage insurance). Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours Inc. disclaims responsibility for accidents, personal illness or injury, trip cancellations, or handling of baggage not under our control. All categories of insurance may be purchased from Canterbury as provided by Allianz Travel Insurance.
Not Included: Gratuities, room service, laundry, telephone calls, and all personal expenses.
Liability: Canterbury Pilgrimages & Tours, Inc., and their employees, shareholders, officers and directors (collectively "CPT") do not own or operate any entity which is to or does provide goods or services for your pilgrimage including, for example, lodging facilities, transportation companies, local ground operators, including, without limitation, various entities which may utilize the CPT name, guides, sightseeing companies, entertainment, food or drink service providers, equipment suppliers, etc. As a result, CPT is not responsible for any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any person or entity. In addition, CPT is not responsible for any negligent or willful act or failure to act of any person or entity they do not own or control, nor for any act or inaction of any other third party not under their control. Without limitations CPT is not liable for any direct, indirect, consequential, or incidental damage, injury, death, loss, accident, delay, inconvenience or irregularity of any kind which may be occasioned by reason of any act or omission beyond their control, including, without limitation any willful or negligent act, failure to act, breach of contract or violation of local law or regulation of any third party such as an airline, train, hotel, bus, taxi, van, local ground handler or guide, whether or not it uses the CPT name, financial default or insolvency of any supplier which is to, or does supply any goods or services for this trip. Should any of the persons listed in the tentative itinerary and schedule of speakers be unable to participate in this event, every effort will be made to secure a substitute. Regardless of the participation of persons listed in the tentative itinerary and schedule of speakers the pilgrimage tour will proceed as scheduled on the dates listed. By signing this form to participate in this pilgrimage tour, you agree that the terms of the cancellation penalty will be binding upon you regardless of whether persons listed in the tentative itinerary and schedule of speakers are able to participate. CPT will not be responsible for any loss incurred by traveler, including lost days of the scheduled tour, due to a cancelled flight or other means and modes of transportation. Please investigate purchasing travel insurance as recommended, to cover any type of loss associated with cancelled air or other transportation.
