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GUADALUPE MEXICO PILGRIMAGE WITH FR. JORDAN EASLEY



Metropolitan Cathedral

February 22, 2027 | Our Pilgrimage Begins

Our pilgrimage begins as we depart Boston on our flight to Mexico City, Mexico. Upon arrival, our local professional tour escort will greet us and accompany us to our hotel. After check-in, we gather this evening for a welcome dinner to begin our pilgrimage together. Overnight Mexico City.

Flight 1 – Outbound American Airlines Flight 641 Departing: Boston (BOS) to Mexico City (MEX) Date: February 22 Departure: 9:30 AM / Arrival: 3:10 PM Economy class (airfare is subject to change)

February 23 | Tlatelolco & Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe

We begin this morning at the Plaza de las Tres Culturas in Tlatelolco, where the last battle of the Aztec empire was fought in 1521 and where the Church of Santiago Tlatelolco stands as one of the oldest churches in the Americas. It was here that Juan Diego was baptized and received instruction from Bishop Zumárraga, rooting the story of Guadalupe in the living faith of the indigenous people who first received it. We then make our way to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas, where we celebrate Mass in the modern Basilica before the miraculous Tilma of Juan Diego. We also visit the Church of the Hill, the Church of the Well, the Monument of the Offerings, and the Church of the Indians. The afternoon is free for personal prayer at the shrine. Dinner and overnight in Mexico City.

February 24 | Zócalo, Metropolitan Cathedral & Chalco

This morning we explore the historic center of Mexico City, visiting the great Zócalo, the National Palace, and the Templo Mayor, the excavated ruins of the Great Pyramid of Tenochtitlán that once stood at the heart of the Aztec world. We also visit the Metropolitan Cathedral, the largest cathedral in Latin America, touring its remarkable interior and venerating the Tomb of Bishop Juan de Zumárraga, the first Bishop of Mexico. After lunch we travel to Chalco to visit Girlstown, a mission community run by the Sisters of Mary. Upon arrival we take a guided tour of the campus before spending time visiting and engaging with the students. We then gather in the Spiritual Center for a buffet dinner, followed by the Rosary in the

gymnasium. We close the evening with Community Mass, celebrated together with the sisters and girls, and a brief presentation by the students before departing for our hotel. Overnight in Mexico City.

February 25 | Church of San José del Altillo & Conchita's House

This morning we visit the Church of San José del Altillo, a Modernist chapel of remarkable architectural beauty designed in 1958, where the relics of Blessed Conchita Cabrera de Armida rest in the crypt. Conchita, born in 1862 in San Luis Potosí, was a wife, mother of nine children, widow, mystic, and prolific spiritual writer who founded the Apostleship of the Cross and whose interior life left a profound mark on the Mexican Church. Beatified on May 4, 2019 at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, she became the first Mexican laywoman to receive that recognition. We celebrate Mass here and spend time in prayer at her tomb. We then tour the house where Conchita lived, gaining an intimate glimpse into the daily life of a woman who pursued holiness in the midst of the ordinary demands of family, widowhood, and the turbulence of Revolutionary Mexico. Dinner and overnight in Mexico City.

February 26 | Church of the Holy Family & Departure

This morning we visit the Church of the Holy Family, a Jesuit parish in Mexico City and the shrine of Blessed Miguel Pro, the young Jesuit priest who ministered to the faithful in secret during the brutal religious persecution of the Calles regime in the 1920s. Arrested on false charges and executed by firing squad on November 23, 1927, he faced death with his arms outstretched in the form of a cross, crying out “Viva Cristo Rey!” His first-class relics are venerated here, and the church preserves the memory of a martyr whose courage sustained the underground Church through one of the darkest chapters in Mexican Catholic history. We celebrate Mass here before making our way to the airport for our return flight home. With hearts renewed by the witness of Our Lady of Guadalupe and the faith of the Mexican Church, we depart for the United States.
